<p>Illinois Opioid Action Plan</p>	<p>IDPH Director Nirav Shah presented the recently-released State Opioid Action Plan. Background: Since 2008, 11,000 people have died of opioid overdose in IL. In 2016, there were approx. 1,900 deaths, greater than car accidents and homicides. Fentanyl and fentanyl analogues are making the problem worse. This problem exists across the state of IL and no geography, race, ethnicity, or social stratum is immune.</p> <p>Directors of state agencies have been meeting for 9 months do come up with plan. Goal is to reduce the number of opioid-related deaths by 1/3 from the projected number in 2020 (projected number= 2,700; goal=1,800).</p> <p>The Opioid response advisory council will be meeting Thursday, Sept. 14th and anyone can join.</p> <p>Plan: 3 pillars: prevention, treatment, response. Standing order for naloxone to be released soon. This is not a tactical document – it is what we need to do. Tactical document will start coming together next week.</p> <p>What can SHIP group do? (1) NAS is referenced in the document – needs work from MCH experts for tactical document. (2) Stigma reduction – talk about OUD openly and honestly. Facts and numbers are important, but emphasize the human problem.</p> <p>Comment: we need to contextualized destigmatizing opioid use with stigmas in other substance use and mental health disorders. The hope is that reorienting how people think about people suffering from opioid use disorder will lead to changes in how they perceive those suffering from other substance use disorders.</p>

Will be meeting with external parties • Maternal morbidity and mortality – updating review committee as part of CDC initiative. One committee is reviewing overdoses, suicide, etc. • ILPQC – maternal hypertension initiative • 2018 – working with NAS committee – focus on moms and babies affected by opioids • 2018 – Illinois hospitals providing IUDs after delivery. Similar work going on in South Carolina – increased patient satisfaction. Colorado and Ohio working on similar projects <p>Illinois Department of Transportation</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Call for projects –grant for transportation enhancement program. Focus on bikes and pedestrians • Bike network – connecting routes and trails • Long range transportation plan – shaping policy for the next 20 years • Springfield bike sharing program <p>DHS</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Large SAMHSA grants – opioid STR grant (\$15.3 million). Eligible for second year of funding • West side treatment program • Programs: pre-release MAT, post-release, warm handoff in EDs, immediate referrals • Picking vendor to establish and run opioid crisis line 24/7. Feature: call-back afterwards <p>EPA</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Unwanted medication disposal – concerned about flushing meds down the toilet. Working with law enforcement and pharmacies to collect unused meds • Lead in drinking water is big focus. Testing/education. <p>ISBE</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Every Student Succeeds Act/ How to provide education that meets the needs of all students. Support students, support staff

Unfinished Business	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Amendments to enabling legislation – no report requirement needs to be added, as it is already in the statute. Amendment being considered to collapse the Planning Council and ICC into one group SHIP Reporting Form – online form has been created as requested. Discussed elements of form, but this will be released as-is to SHIP ICC for completion and comments. It should be considered “version 1” with changes possible in the future 	
New Business	Social Determinants of Health and Access to Care – we need to figure out how to address these. Discussion of whether to treat them as separate priority areas or integrate them into other priorities? Possible to do both. Integrate them, but also encourage activities addressing them that don’t involve other three priority areas. This is incorporated into the activities reporting form.	<p>Health equity discussion will be added to next agenda</p> <p>IDPH will send Doodle poll prior to scheduling next meeting</p>
